Rooms without a view. The challenges faced so far through the conservation and restoration of the disassembled interiors of Charles Rennie Mackintosh's Ingram Street Tea Rooms

In 1971 interiors designed between 1900 and 1911 by Charles Rennie Mackintosh were salvaged from a building on Glasgow's Ingram Street. The interiors occupying a building space of 1466m sq had been operational as tea rooms until 1951. Since the 1980s Glasgow Museums has undertaken extensive material analysis and research assessment of over 3000 individual room elements. Some rooms have been conserved and restored for display. We now have a comprehensive understanding of what these rooms once comprised of, and the issues we have to address should we continue to restore the tea rooms either whole or in part. This paper presents a summary of the findings and processes employed, and identifies the key issues we have to address for the future: authenticity, experience, accessibility, scale and preservation.
